Objectives and Investment Policy

Objective

The fund's goal is to provide income, comprised of dividends and interest, and to achieve long term growth of the fund's value.

Investment Policy

- The fund invests at least 80% of its assets in shares of infrastructure companies from around the world, including companies from developed and emerging market countries.
- The fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in shares of infrastructure companies from emerging market countries.
- The fund invests in a number of infrastructure sectors such as gas, electricity and water utilities, toll roads, airports, rail and communications.
- The fund will usually invest in a concentrated portfolio, typically 30 to 60 companies.
- The fund may invest in derivatives to help try to achieve the fund's objective as well as to reduce risk or cost or to generate additional growth or income for the fund.

Share Class Policy

- For this share class certain fees and expenses may be charged to capital rather than income. This will result in an increase in income available for distribution by foregoing some of the capital that the share class would have available for future investment and potential growth. In addition, all or some portion, of realised and unrealised capital gains

net of realised and unrealised capital losses may be declared as a dividend.

Benchmark: OECD G7 Inflation Index plus 5.5%

Manager's Discretion: The fund is actively managed. The investment manager uses the benchmark as its target return for the fund – over the long term the investment manager seeks to provide an average annual return of the OECD G7 Inflation Index (which return will vary over time) plus 5.5%. "OECD G7" refers to the following countries: Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the UK and the US. There is no guarantee that the investment manager will meet its target, and the target does not take into account the fees charged, which will reduce the fund's return. The benchmark does not constrain the investment manager's management of the fund.

Transaction Costs: The fund bears costs in buying and selling investments, which may have a material impact on the fund's performance.

Dealing Frequency: You can buy, sell and switch your shares on each day that the New York Stock Exchange is open for business.

Minimum Initial Investment: For this share class the minimum initial investment is USD 1,000.

Treatment of Income: For this share class all, or some portion of, net income is declared and paid monthly to shareholders.

Risk and Reward Profile



The indicator is based on the volatility of the returns (past performance) of the reported share class (calculated on a 5 year rolling return basis). Where a share class is inactive / has less than 5 years of returns, the returns of a representative benchmark are used.

The fund is in its risk/reward category because investment in shares of infrastructure companies from various countries and sectors have historically been subject to relatively large fluctuations in value.

The fund is subject to the following risks which are materially relevant but may not be adequately captured by the indicator:

Investment in company shares: The fund invests in shares of companies, and the value of these shares can be negatively affected by changes in the company, its industry or the economy in which it operates.

Investment in infrastructure: The fund invests in shares of infrastructure companies, and the value of these shares can be negatively affected by economic or regulatory occurrences affecting their industries. Investments

in new infrastructure projects carry risks where they may not be completed within the budget, agreed timeframe or specifications. Operational and supply disruptions can also have a negative effect on the value of the company's shares.

Emerging markets investment: The fund may invest in the markets of countries which are smaller, less developed and regulated, and more volatile than the markets of more developed countries.

Concentrated fund: The fund invests in fewer companies than other funds which invest in shares usually do. This means that the fund does not spread its risk as widely as other funds and will therefore be affected more if an individual company has significant losses.

Fund currency: Changes in exchange rates between the currencies of investments held by the fund and the fund's base currency may negatively affect the value of an investment and any income received from it.

Derivatives: The use of derivatives can result in greater fluctuations of the fund's value and may cause the fund to lose as much as or more than the amount invested.

Sustainability: The fund's integration of sustainability risks in the investment decision process may have the effect of excluding profitable investments from the investment universe of the fund and may also cause the fund to sell investments that will continue to perform well. A sustainability risk could materialise due to an environmental, social or governance event or condition which may impact the fund's investments and negatively affect the returns of the fund.

Fund operations: The fund is subject to the risk of loss resulting from inadequate or failed internal processes, people or systems or those of third parties such as those responsible for the custody of its assets, especially to the extent that it invests in developing countries.

Charges from capital: Fees and expenses of this share class may be charged to the capital of the share class rather than its income. This policy will result in an increase in income available for distribution to investors. However, this will forego some of the capital that the share class has available for future investment and potential growth.
